## From the President:

At this time, Lake Chippewa is fortunate. We don't have any ecological disasters looming over us. We don't have any big developments threatening to crowd our shores. - Building and maintaining Loon nesting platforms.
- Artificial reefs, fish attracting devices.
- Citizen lake monitoring - already being done.
- Dredging the passageway to the bay at the South end of the lake.
